

Program Delivery Support Services – Consideration of Award of Contract

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Summary of Request

- Consideration to provide approval to execute and award the Program Delivery Support services contract
- Provide professional services to the Authority for support and technical expertise related to the delivery of the program

The Program Delivery Support consultant will be:


- Responsible for working closely and cooperatively with the Authority's executive leadership, financial consultants and local, state and federal agencies.
- Responsible for supporting the Authority in managing project delivery consultants including, but not limited to, regional consultants, design consultants, right-of way consultants and environmental consultants.
- Responsible to provide expertise to the Authority to link program management and construction management to create a singular project controls system that optimizes program management.



Key Authority objectives for Program Delivery Support contract:

- Assign appropriate roles for state staff and Program Delivery Support (PDS) staff.
- Consistent with the Authority's "Form-to-Function" review, ensure state staff and PDS staff are assigned appropriate roles and responsibilities.
- State staff have been augmented over time to assume some roles previously performed by the current RDP.
- Reduce the number of layers/interfaces between different consultants and Authority over time.
- The new PDS contract would include additional, optional, scope of services to provide Project and Construction Management (PCM) services for civil works.







- The procurement process for the PDS services contract was managed directly by Authority staff as a qualification-based contract.
- The procurement is governed by the state's Architectural & Engineering (A&E) requirements. The Authority proceeded in accordance with Government Code section 4525 et seq., the Authority's regulations, Board policies for Requests for Qualifications (RFQ), and other applicable state and federal requirements.
- Small business, Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) and Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise (DVBE) utilization goals are also included in the requirements.
 - » 30% Small Business utilization goal, inclusive of 10% DBE utilization goal and 3% DVBE utilization goal
- Offerors were scored pursuant to the following criteria as set forth in the RFQ:

Total Score for Statement of Qualifications and Discussions	Maximum Score
Total Weighted SOQ Score	60
Total Weighted Discussion Score	40

- The Authority received two Statements of Qualifications (SOQ) in response to its RFQ for Program Delivery Support issued on February 18, 2022.
- The SOQs were submitted by the following Offerors:
 - » Connect CA Partners, which is comprised of Bechtel Infrastructure Corporation, Mott MacDonald, Michael Baker International, CBRE, Gail Zeidler, Psomas, Vanir and 28 SB/DBE/DVBE firms.
 - » AECOM-Fluor Joint Venture, which includes Atlas Technical Consultants, Egis Rail S.A., Turner & Townsend, McMillen Jacobs Associates, and Jaquith Consulting Group and 26 SB/DBE/DVBE firms.
- Environmental, social and governance (ESG) efforts, which may include any environmental sustainability efforts, socio-economic equity policies, and governance policies, or a report were incorporated as a pass/fail requirement in the RFQ.
- Each Offeror was scored on its SOQ pursuant to the criteria set forth in the RFQ.
- The two top-ranked Offerors were invited to Discussions with the Authority and the two Offerors were scored on their Discussions using the criteria in the RFQ.



- Final scores were computed from weighted combinations of SOQ and Discussion scores, in accordance with the RFQ.
- Each Offeror's ranking is shown below, with the highest final score shown as Rank 1.

- Pre-award reviews were conducted concurrently with negotiations prior to execution.
- Transition between Rail Delivery Partner and Program Delivery Support consultants.



This is an action item and staff recommends approval of the associated resolution which would in summary:

- Authorize the CEO or designee of the CEO to execute a four-year contract with AECOM-Fluor Joint Venture for up to \$400 million and direct the CEO to manage the contract within that budget.
- The Agreement will include a performance-based fee in order to align the PDS Consultant's performance with the Authority's performance objectives. This performance regime will be 5% of the contract cost, or \$20M.
