Funds <u>must</u> be used for projects that...

- 1. Reduce GHG emissions
- 2. Invest in the most disadvantaged communities in the State
- 3. Maximize economic, environmental, and public health benefits

- Sustainable Agricultural Land Conservation (Strategic Growth Council)
- Urban Forestry and Greening (CalFire)
- Cleaner Fuels and Vehicles (Air Resources Board)








Transformative Climate Communities

- Concentrate CCI funds in the most disadvantaged communities
- Place-based approach
- Coordinated, integrated climate strategies
- Implementation Grants (\$140 M)
 - \$70 M in City of Fresno
 - \$35 M in City of Los Angeles
 - \$25 M in a 3rd city, TBD
- Planning Grants (\$1.5 M)
 - 5-10 grants statewide





Transformative Climate Communities: Current DRAFT Guidelines (as of July, 2017)

- Multi-disciplinary project teams
- Project area no more than 5 square miles
- Coordinated projects
- Consistency with adopted plans (incl. Station Area Plans)
- For communities in "Valley-to-Valley" section of HSR:
 - Required multimodal connectivity
 - Amenities in HSR station area
 - Housing connectivity to HSR



Transformative Climate Communities: Expected Timeline

- Public input on draft guidelines Summer 2017
- Final draft guidelines and Council consideration August, 2017

SB 1: Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017: Selected Transit/Land Use-Related Programs

- **Solutions for Congested Corridors**: \$250 M annually competitive grants, includes transit and multimodal improvements
- *Active Transportation: \$100 M annually competitive grants for walking and biking improvements
- Local transportation planning grants: \$25 M annually competitive grants for priority projects in counties and cities with voter-approved transportation taxes and fees
- Local Partnership Program: \$200 M annually highways
- *State Highway Operation and Protection (SHOPP): \$1.9 B annually State highway repair, safety and operational improvements
- Local Streets and Roads: \$1.5 B annually for road maintenance and repair, and capital projects after pavement condition target reached
- *State Transportation Improvement Program
- *Transit and Intercity Rail
- * Adds funds to existing program
